Contesting as a Means to an End

What do you like to do? Work DX? County hunting? Summits/Parks/Islands on the air? Traffic handling? **Emergency Communications?** Collect wallpaper? Experimentation? Try new bands and modes?

What do you like to do? Work DX? Many worldwide contests throughout the year: February – ARRL Int'l DX contest March/May – CQ WPX July – IARU HF World Championship Oct/Nov - CQ Worldwide

What do you like to do? Work DX? Many other countries sponsor contests as well! Russia – UK/British Empire – Germany Spain – Japan - Canada Worked All Europe (summer) All Asia – All Africa - Oceania

What do you like to do? *County Hunting?* **State QSO Parties are perfect for County Hunters!** Every State or Region has a QSO Party Exchange usually includes County You can win fish, wine, blankets

In general, contesting teaches you to make efficient contacts, passing essential information accurately

Simulated Emergency Test - not a real contest but there is a competitive aspect

Field Day

In general, contesting teaches you to make efficient contacts, passing essential information accurately

What do you like to do? *Collect wallpaper?* WAS in a weekend! NAQP – Sweepstakes **DXCC** in a weekend! ARRL DX, IARU or CQ Worldwide Needed states, countries, prefixes, zones, grids add up fast!

- Usually a specific focus
- Make (lots of) two-way contacts
- Multipliers
- Keep score
- Rules

MAJOR CONTESTS

- CQ Worldwide (Fall)
- CQ WPX (Spring)
- ARRL DX (Winter)
- ARRL Sweepstakes (November)
- IARU (Summer)
- Field Day (not a contest)

MINOR CONTESTS

- Regional (WAE, Oceania)
- Country-specific (WAG, RAC)
- State QSO Parties
- North American QSO Parties
- Single-band (10, 160, VHF)

SPECIALTY CONTESTS

- Sprints NCCC, SKCC
- CWOps, NAQCC, PhoneFray, SST
- FYBO, ARS
- CQ WE, OMISS, YLRL
- 10-10, SMIRK

CONTEST SCORING

QSO Points

 Usually 1 or 2, sometimes more for DX

Multipliers

 States-Counties-Zones-Prefixes-Grid Squares depending on contest

Score = Points x Multipliers

- VHF/UHF contests

- All bands & modes available
- But subbands limited on some HF bands
- Best DX found in the Extra segments

- School Club Roundup
- Collegiate QSO Party

The Contest Exchange

Information sent and received

- RST and serial number
- RST and location
- RST and zone
- Name and state



Sweepstakes = Message header

Must be sent & received correctly by both to count as a complete contact

Run vs. Search & Pounce

Run

- Calls CQ and others answer
- High rates possible
- Big Guns primarily run

Search & Pounce

- Answer other stations' CQ
- Usually produces more mults per QSO
- Little Pistols usually S&P

Making a S&P QSO Find a run station Answer CQ – Call sign once Copy his exchange Ask for repeats if needed Send yours briskly but clearly Be ready to supply repeats Log and move on

- No extraneous stuff
- No screwy phonetics
- Exchange in correct order
- Give complete exchange
- Run station goes first
- "Please Copy"

Tips for more enjoyable contesting

- Learn your rig
- Test everything beforehand
- Use contest logging software
- Use a headset
- When in doubt, ask for a repeat
- Don't rely on the spots

Tips for more enjoyable contesting

- Time = rate = score
 - Don't waste time in a pileup
 - Don't waste time with alligators
- K3ZO rule of twice
- Friday night is for the Big Guns
- Slower CW high in the band






